RDSP News from the Government of Canada - Human Resources and Skills Development Canada

In the coming months, a *Statement of Entitlement* (SoE) will be sent to all RDSP holders. This annual mail-out was implemented last year. The SoE provides important information about the amount of grants and bonds that an RDSP beneficiary is entitled to receive from the Government of Canada each year. Unused grant and bond entitlements from past years can be claimed as well (going back to 2008, the year that the RDSP became available). Grant and bond entitlements are based on the beneficiary's family income, as determined through the Canada Child Tax Benefit or Income Tax Returns filed. Grant entitlements also depend on how much money is contributed to the RDSP.

To ensure receipt of the SoE, RDSP holders are encouraged to contact their financial institution as soon as possible, if their mailing address has changed.

Manitoba Disability News - An update on Accessibility-Rights Legislation in Manitoba

On September 6, 2012, Minister Howard released the Manitoba Accessibility Advisory Councils (MAAC) recommendations for accessibility - rights legislation and standards that would help "identify, remove and prevent barriers faced by people with disabilities." The Minister gave the public until October 21st to provide comment on the recommendations. Barrier Free Manitoba responded with a 134 page response "Stronger Measures Essential for Effective Legislation Comments on the Manitoba Accessibility Advisory Council's Recommendations" released on October 1, 2012. Their response concluded that: the new legislation is essential, the MAAC's recommendations simply do not go far enough, and the legislation must incorporate the stronger measures identified by Barrier Free Manitoba. Thanks to many of our Continuity Care members for signing and sending in the action postcards supporting Barrier Free Manitoba's call for stronger measures and signing the online petition.


Minister Howard now has until January 18, 2013 to prepare a response to the report and the community feedback she has received.
